Adult volunteers:

Each troop requires 1 leader and at least 2 assistant leaders. There is one Girl Scout Coordinator. Approximately 12 leaders are needed.

Duties: Leaders work with the girls to receive various badges for work done, and also do projects and activities related to their age group. Leaders and assistants must arrive before the meetings to set up for projects and prepare refreshments. Some shopping is necessary for badges, pins, & materials for projects. Time commitment is about 3 hours a week.

Skills: You should like to work with children, and have patience. Having some craft abilities is very helpful.
